

The featured subject at our San Diego Chapter dinner meeting will be a presentation of the largest San Diego Zoo construction project ever commissioned. The project Exhibit is called "Africa Rocks" and involves many African creatures on this 16-acre site. This project involves many new buildings, and creates extensive new pathways and landscape features. It will include several different typographies from coastal to inland Africa, Steve Fobes with San Diego Zoo Global will be presenting details about this project, process and unique challenges encountered throughout the design phase.

When the exhibit opens in 2017, Africa Rocks will entirely transform the area that was previously a steep canyon. Africa Rocks' gently winding, ADA-accessible pathway will lead guests through different types of African habitats—including a West African forest, acacia woodlands, Ethiopian highlands, kopje gardens and a Madagascar habitat.

Africa Rocks will be a home to mammals, reptiles, birds, and plant life native to Africa. The exhibit will feature a range of primates, including hamadryas and gelada baboons, vervet monkeys, and lemurs. Other mammals in the exhibit will include southern ratel, fossa and an African leopard.

BRIEF OVERVIEW







Monarch School is dedicated to helping San Diego's homeless children break the cycle of poverty through education.

Monarch is a K-12 public school providing students with an accredited education, tutoring, after school program and college preparation as well as basic necessities such as medical and dental care, vision care, food and clothing, hygiene kits, transportation and family assistance.

Monarch is a public-private partnership between the San Diego County Office of Education (SDCOE) and the nonprofit Monarch School Project, a 501(c)(3) corporation.

Monarch serves homeless children in grades K-12, ages 4-19, who live in San Diego County. Our students live in shelters, motels, single room occupancy housing, double- or tripled-up with other families in small apartments, at camp sites, in cars, or on the streets.

Homeless students have often been absent from school for long periods of time and are achieving below grade level when they enroll. Monarch removes barriers typically encountered by homeless students and provides programs and services not offered at traditional schools. Our program is designed to help students catch up to their age-appropriate grade level in a welcoming, accepting environment.

Monarch School began in 1988 as a downtown drop-in center for homeless youth, funded by SDCOE and staffed by a single teacher. In 2001 the school relocated to a small facility on Cedar Street and soon reached its enrollment capacity of 150 students.

In 2013 Monarch completed construction of a new, larger school in the San Diego community of Barrio Logan. The Monarch School Nat & Flora Bosa Campus includes a two-story 51,000-square-foot facility on 2.2 acres and allows for enrollment of 350 students.

The number of homeless families in San Diego continues to grow, and it is a very real crisis for the children, and for our community. Currently there are nearly 18,000 homeless children in San Diego County, according to SDCOE.

Without intervention, homeless youth run the risk of becoming chronically homeless adults and will likely repeat the cycle of homelessness for another generation of children. Education and support services can change the course of their lives and put them on the path to success.

Monarch School is the largest and most comprehensive K-12 program of its kind for homeless students in the U.S., and is a model for how a community can successfully educate homeless children to become productive citizens.
